

Counseling Psychology Clerkship (CPSE 778R) and Spring/Summer Practicum (CPSE 776R/777R)

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Objectives

1. Provide supervision and oversight of clerkship and practicum training by providing a forum to discuss students' experiences.
2. Facilitate professional development throughout the doctoral program.
3. Provide a context in which to share expertise and insights gained in particular training settings.
4. Provide support and direction throughout the internship application and selection process.
5. Explore various career options for psychologists

Course Structure

The class will meet on Friday mornings from 10 a.m. to 11 a.m. in WSC 1510 or 1517. Since the course is participatory, attendance will be the primary consideration in assigning grades. Students will be allowed one discretionary absence each semester/term. Subsequent absences will result in a 1/3 grade deduction.

Participation and Professional Development

Students are expected to come prepared to discuss professional issues that they are encountering in their training site. Each class member will be responsible to either present or arrange for a presenter on a topic of interest once during each semester.
